We may ask for additional information.

Verification of 2018 IRS Income Tax Return Information for Student Tax Filers

Important note: The instructions below apply to the student who filed taxes in 2018.

Instructions: Complete this section if the student filed or will file a 2018 IRS Income Tax Return(s). The best way to verify income is by using the IRS Data Retrieval Tool (IRS DRT) that is part of FAFSA on the Web at FAFSA.gov. In most cases, no further documentation is needed to verify 2018 IRS income tax return information that was transferred into the student's FAFSA using the IRS DRT if that information was not changed.

The transcript displays online upon successful completion of the IRS's two-step authentication.
 - Automated Telephone Request – 1-800-908-9946. Transcripts is generally received within 10 business days from the IRS's receipt of the telephone request.
 - Paper Request Form – IRS Form 4506T-EZ or Form 4506-T. The transcript is generally received within 10 business days from the IRS's receipt of the paper request form.

Verification of 2018 IRS Income Information for Parent Tax Filers

High School Completion Status

Identity and Statement of Educational Purpose

The student must appear in person at The Baptist College of Florida Financial Aid Office to verify his or her identity by presenting an unexpired valid government-issued photo identification (ID), such as, but not limited to, a driver's license, other state-issued ID, or passport. The institution will maintain a copy of the student's photo ID that is annotated with the date it was received and reviewed, and the name of the official at the institution authorized to receive and review the student's ID.

In addition, the student must sign, in the presence of The Baptist College of Florida Financial Aid Office, the **Statement of Educational Purpose** below.

If the student is unable to appear in person at The Baptist College of Florida Financial Aid Office to verify his or her identity, the student must provide to the institution:

- (a) A copy of the unexpired valid government-issued photo identification (ID) that is acknowledge in the notary statement below, or that is presented to a notary, such as, but not limited to a driver's license, other state-issued ID, or passport; and
- (b) The original **Statement of Educational Purpose** provided below, which must be notarized. If the notary statement appears on a separate page than the Statement of Educational Purpose, there must be a clear indication that the Statement of Educational Purpose was the document notarized.
