Your 2019-2020 Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) was selected for review in a process called verification. If there are differences, your FAFSA information may need to be corrected. You and a parent whose information was reported on the FAFSA must complete and sign this institutional verification document, attach any required documents, and submit the form and other required documents to the financial aid office at The Baptist College of Florida. We may ask for additional information. If you have questions about verification, contact us as soon as possible so that your financial aid will not be delayed.
